#### **BACKGROUND AND OVERVIEW:**

The Visit Fort Bragg Promotions program is funded from a portion of the Measure AA increase in Transient Occupancy Taxes from 10% to 12%. City Council included \$25,000 to the Visit Fort Bragg Committee (VFB) for discretionary spending. At the regularly scheduled meet held on July 11, 2023, VFB considered a variety of uses for this funding. Staff has organized these many fantastic ideas into a table for VFB consideration and discussion.
