- Business to Business: 8%





Fort Bragg 1% Sales Tax Forecast (Soft Landing)







Sales Tax Future Caveats – Uncertainty...

- The Pandemic Recession is Different No Playbook
 Primary impacts to date: restaurants, gas, apparel
- Regional Impacts Vary Greater Impact on areas reliant on International Tourism, Business Travel, Office Workers
- Uncertain Virus/Health Impacts Variants etc. create future uncertainty
- Uncertain Economic Pathway Consumer Behavior,
 Unemployment Trends, Supply Chains, Energy Markets,
 Inflation, Interest Rates, 'New Normal'?



Legislative Activity – State Budget Passed

- State budget completed end of June, but Governor and Legislature will continue to negotiate on various aspects and details throughout session
- Bills have had their 'first cut' from 4,000 to 1,800 and will be going to committee in August for discussion and amendments.
- Various land use control bills related to housing and STRs from Wicks, Portantino,
 & Flora etc. (League opposes)
- Dodd Climate Change Resilience most noteworthy of environmental leg bills
- Sales Tax Exemption bills from Levine (Covid) and Grayson (manufacturing) both being closely watched by League
- State budget includes a variety of 'treasure' for taxpayers & local governments
 - State 'relief' payments of \$9.5 billion (checks of \$200 to \$1,050 to be sent in October to 17.5 million CA tax filers)
 - \$2.3 billion in fiscal relief to small businesses and non-profits
 - \$1.95 billion in emergency rental assistance for low-income households
 - \$1.4 billion for past due utility bills
 - \$700 million for Homeless Encampment Resolution grants over two years
 - \$2.5 billion in funding for a wide variety of affordable housing programs
 - \$25 million for a competitive grant program for local gun buyback
 - \$19.3 climate & energy package (determined in future legislation)
