

45% or more of survey respondents support the following investments in the Central Business District:


- Create Public Gathering Spaces

Survey Respondents

Only 26% of respondents rent, and pay less than 30% of income on housing, and most survey participants enjoy a high sense of satisfaction with their living situation. Most survey respondents have one full-time job with benefits and a large number identified as retired.
