- At least 70 U.S. cities nationwide have passed resolutions condemning the violence. Nearby examples include Cotati, Oakland, and San Francisco; farther afield, Chicago just became the largest city in the nation to do so (*Reuters*).
- Additionally, hundreds of labor organizations including UAW, SEIU, United Electrical Workers, and the American Federation of Teachers have spoken out against the violence and called for a ceasefire.
- These resolutions create cumulative public pressure that will move up the chain of national representation so our voices can be heard at the federal level. We, the people of Fort Bragg, want to join this groundswell of voices for peace.
