This morning, I met with the realtor (Michelle Deering) for 344 N Main Street, to tour the facility. Additionally, I have reviewed the use permit and all attachments submitted by Element 7. Upon touring the facility, I discovered that it is predominantly in the same condition as it was when the former business was in there. None of the proposed work by Element 7 has been started, which I assume is because the property has not yet been purchased by the company. That being said, there is obviously a lot of site work that needs to be completed before a final inspection can be performed, and all of the security and safety measures can be assessed.

As I discussed with you on the phone yesterday, I have already discussed some of this with Mr. Bloom, and he is fully aware that this is not a process that will completed in short amount of time. I explained to Mr. Bloom that I would further review the company's complete plan as submitted in the application, but a follow up inspection of the facility would need to be completed at a later date.
