




## EDFC OPERATING BUDGET

## EDFC Results & Highlights FY 2019/2020


- Closed Loans: \$1,154,543
- Jobs: New loans helped retain or create 92 jobs
- <u>Technical Assistance</u>: Provided 830 hours to businesses/ applicants
- Currently Available for Lending: \$1,800,000

 <u>COVID impact</u>: Offered deferral of loan payments to all business clients in March; Over 50% took advantage of the deferral (90 days or more)

## Pandemic Response

 Mask-Up Mendo: Partnered with the Chambers – EDFC procured 294,000 surgical masks & 17,500 bottles of hand sanitizer.

• **Business Resiliency Grants**: Supported 3 rounds of grants to businesses by reviewing 120 applications, distributing approximately \$420,000 to businesses.
