CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Lee called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM, all Councilmembers appearing by video conference.

3. STAFF COMMENTS

City Manager Miller gave an update on the CV Starr Community Center LED light project. She reminded water customers to be mindful of conserving water during the dry season. Miller reported that sewage samples were submitted for COVID testing last Wednesday and results are expected early next week. The nomination period for City Council closes on August 7. The Finance and Administration Committee meeting is being rescheduled to August 12 at 11:00 AM. The City Manager announced that the City's new Senior Planner, Tia Sar, took her oath of office today. Chief Naulty reported on a four-car collision that occurred on North Main Street earlier today. He provided updates on police calls and activities.

Councilmember Albin-Smith announced a Mendocino Transit Authority meeting will be held on Wednesday at 1pm via Zoom. Councilmember Morsell-Haye gave an update on behalf of the City Name Change ad hoc committee on the formation of a citizens commission. She stated the ad hoc committee is drafting a proposal to bring to the next Council meeting. Mayor Lee gave an update on coronavirus cases and deaths in Fort Bragg and commended hospital staff for working with and caring for patients. The Mayor announced he plans to hold a video

forum for the business community during the first or second week of August, featuring the authors of The Miller Report, Dr. William Miller, chief of staff of the local hospital, and Tabatha Miller, City Manager.

8. CONDUCT OF BUSINESS

Receive Report and Provide Direction to Staff on Possible Adoption of an Urgency Ordinance Amending the Established Administrative Penalties for Violations of the Mendocino County Facial Coverings Health Order

The City Manager presented the staff report on this agenda item and responded to questions from Councilmembers.

- (3) Change the penalty provisions to \$100, \$250 and \$500 for first, second, and third/subsequent violations; and
- (4) Include Community Service Officers to those who can enforce the administrative penalties.

This Staff Report was referred to staff with directions for preparation of an Emergency Order as outlined above.
