Overview of the BEVRI Plan

The **goal** of the plan is to create a roadmap for coastal resiliency that balances environmental stewardship with economic vitality.


Methods: site-specific technical studies and community engagement

Timeframe: 2 years for planning, 1 year for implementation

The desired **outcomes** are to identify:

- 1) blue economy opportunities and limitations;
- 2) mitigation, adaptation, and resiliency measures;
- 3) and a suite of potential projects, partners, and funding mechanisms for implementation.

Findings will inform updates to the City of Fort Bragg and County of Mendocino Local Coastal Programs.



The Planning Process

Technical Studies:

- Sea Level Rise, Tsunami Hazards, and Erosion Resilience Strategy for Noyo Harbor
- Aquaculture Feasibility Study, including water quality analysis (in partnership with the Noyo Center for Marine Science)
- Special District Analysis
- Harbor Facilities Conditions Assessment
- Parcel Inventory and Land Use Assessment
