Patrol has 16 authorized positions. Most of 2023 we had 10 working.

2022-2023

- Robbery decreased 17%
- Assaults decreased 28%
- Burglary decreased 9%
- Theft decreased 22%

- Rape & Attempt increased 125%
 - Of 9 reports, 6 had enough evidence to present to DA
 3 were rejected
 - Suspects in 5 of the 9 cases were family members
 - 4 of the 9 cases occurred 1-10 years ago
- Vehicle Theft increased 22%
 - TikTok; Flock
- Domestic Violence increased 21%
 - CRU outreach/follow up; Bolt Bags

Traffic

- DUI arrests (proactive): 78
 - >Still double any year previous to 2022.
- Traffic citations (proactive): 467
 - >Still below community threshold.
- Collisions: 94

Evidence and Property

- •3,542 items processed
- •17 pounds of illegal drugs
 - Usable amounts of dangerous narcotics seized:
 - Fentanyl = 6,804
 - Methamphetamine = 4,480
 - Cocaine = 1,406
 - Heroin = 278
- •12,821 illegal pills
- •20 illegal firearms

Training and Skills

- FBPD Core Course List established
 - Crisis Intervention, DUI, Interviewing, Radar, Collision Investigation
- 800 hours of additional, advanced training
- 24 specialty schools
 - Communications, leadership, advanced investigations, narcotics
- Many hosted locally
 - No travel/per diem/lodging, free seats in class

Immediate Benefit: More search warrants authored and served in 2023 than in our history. Many of the warrants were for narcotics sales.

2021 – 1 case; 2022 – 8 cases; 2023 – <u>15</u> cases.

Code Enforcement

- 1 CEO in 2022, 1 more in 2023
- Streamlined and digitized records and processes
- Developed new policies
- 151 new complaints
- Closed 92 complaints
- 14 were unfounded
- 5 Administrative Hearings
- 1 Abatement Warrant
- 1 Misdemeanor Arrest

Care Response Unit (CRU)

- Grant funded
- Provided services to 300 people
- Reconnected 17 to support systems in their place of origin
- EWS provided 600 bed nights to 165 unduplicated individuals
- 27% reduction in police calls involving homeless
- 124 Crisis de-escalations
- 209 clients with behavioral health issues
- Program recognized as a framework for other agencies

Project Right Now (PRN)

- One year of grant funds to address opioid crisis
- Met with nearly all Fort Bragg Middle School and High School students
- Direct services to over 100 youth
- Over 500 trained in Narcan use both in English and Spanish
- Over 300 Narcan doses distributed
- Over 30 taken to rehabilitation, several removed from CJ system
