- Business to Business: 6%






Fort Bragg 1% Sales Tax Forecast






Fort Bragg 1% Sales Tax Past & Future

Sales Tax Future – Settling...

- National Economy Inflation rates have been coming down closer to the Federal Reserve's desired inflation rate of 2%-ish. Unemployment has been creeping up and so it is likely the Federal Reserve will begin cutting rates at its next meeting and continue cutting into 2025. This should add some energy into the economy.
- California Population shifts appear to be ending.
 However, statewide costs remain high for housing,
 energy, and other essentials. High costs erode some of
 the consumer capacity for taxable sales.
