3. CONDUCT OF BUSINESS

3A. 24-924 Receive a Report on the Policy Options for East of Fort Bragg - Annexation and/or Expansion of the Utility Service Area

Consultant Jones presented the report. Committee Members asked clarifying questions regarding the following topics: How to serve residents who have had their wells go dry and/or failed septic; if all residents would be required to connect to sewer and water; what LAFCo's view on the City expanding the Municipal Improvement District (MID) is; is the City or the property owner responsible to the cost of services being brought to each property; does the existing MID need to be redone, and if so, what are the pros and cons for doing so; what is the cost the City will bear for redoing the MID; how will residents be affected if their property were to be rezoned or "upzoned"; if the City chooses the route of Mello-Roos, would they need to change the General Plan to agree to shoulder the cost of not receiving taxes from property owners; and clarifying the differences in cost across the four annexation areas in Map LU-3.

<u>Public Comment:</u> Stewart Reed (Area 3); Evan Peterson (Area 4); Melvin Pyorre; Jacob Patterson (Area 4); Paul Clark; Jill Rexrode (Area 2); Teddy Wildflower (Area 2); Scott Hockett; David Jensen; Mike Thomas (Area 2).

<u>Discussion:</u> Committee Member Norvell gave context as to why the discussion was brought to the Committee- community members voicing concerns about failed septic systems. He reminded the room that it is the department Staff's job to bring all options to the Committee to make an educated decision. Committee Member Norvell directed staff to bring a report directly to City Council, looking into options for property owners with failed septic to hook into City sewer without annexation. Chair Godeke directed staff to look into fixing the issue with the existing MID and try to include residents with a failed septic system. Consultant Jones noted that the Council can decide to offer just sewer or offer both sewer and water to residents in the expanded MID. City Manager Whippy will discuss the MID issue with LAFCo and bring it to Council if needed. Consultant Jones noted that reestablishing the existing MID and establishing an expanded MID would need to be decided on by Resolution at City Council and by election.

3B. 24-958 Receive Oral Update on Installation of City Trees Downtown & Citywide

Chair Godeke gave an update on tree planting in the City. Committee Member Norvell commended Committee Member Godeke's efforts and noted that the dog park is a great option. Public Comment: None

SUBJECT: Policy Options for Par Course Equipment on the Coastal Trail

ISSUE

The Community Development Committee (CDC) requested a preliminary plan to discuss installing a Par Course in Noyo Headlands Park.

ANALYSIS

Prior to bringing this item forward to City Council for further direction, it would be helpful for the CDC to provide direction on the following general issues.

Issue 1: Visual Resources. Noyo Headlands Park and the Coastal Trail are well known now throughout California as an amazing accessible location to get exercise and take in the natural beauty of the ocean, the coast, the park, and the hills and town to the east of the park. If the City Council chooses to go forward with this idea protection of the views to the ocean is required by the Coastal Act and the coastal development permit.

Possible Solutions:

- Locate Par Course equipment to the east of the coastal trail in locations without exceptional visual quality.
- Congregated equipment in three or four areas for a mini workout, rather than offering workout stations dotted along the trail.
- Select neutral and natural tones such as wood for all equipment.
- Avoid plastic and composite materials as they may not be compatible with the natural feel of the Coastal Trail.

Issue 2: Longevity. The coastal environment is extremely hard on all materials except for stainless steel and wood. Additionally, visitors are likely to be hard on this equipment.

Most of the beautiful benches on site are now heavily carved with graffiti, the same will likely happen to Par Course Equipment.

Possible Solution: Require that equipment be stainless steel and wood. Place equipment in areas that are visible to other trail users to reduce damage.

Issue 3: Cultural Resources. Installation of Park Course equipment should avoid cultural resources; therefore, some areas of the site are not an appropriate location for Par Course equipment, and they have been excluded from the maps below.

POTENTIAL LOCATIONS

The maps below illustrate potential locations that may be suitable for Par Course equipment. MJC recommends that CDC select three or four locations, at most, from the possible locations.

South Coastal Trail Parking Lot Area – pick one of two locations?



South Coastal Trail Middle Area – possible location but has visual sensitivity



South Coastal Trail Runway/WWTF - pick one location.



Middle Coastal Trail - pick one.



North Coastal Trail - Otsuchi point - pick one or skip this location.



North Coastal Trail – Parking Lot is suitable for low profile equipment only. Pick one site only or skip this location.

Par course equipment is built with two concepts in mind:

1) blend into the outdoor environment; 2) keep it simple. Many are made of wood with metal posts in green, tan or brown. Some pieces are self-explanatory, but because of the simplicity of the equipment, the purpose of every station isn't always obvious. So the stations should come with illustrated panels that show how to use equipment.

I just received the notice about this Special Meeting. As much as I am in favor of installing outdoor exercise equipment in 3 or 4 locations along the Coastal Trail I am dismayed that the public is only given 1 day to check out these locations and have input. I am aware that this is only a preliminary plan, and that the issue will also be discussed by the City Council, but that is still not giving the public time to look into this. Why is the public not given more time to weigh in? Why is this so crucial that a last minute Special Meeting has to be scheduled?

As this is in the Coastal Zone, in a highly scenic area is there no need for a Coastal Development Permit, a MND?

The agenda lists different companies and also different exercise equipment. I am glad that the CDC is conscious about the visual resources and wants to select 3 or 4 locations; neutral, and natural tones; and stick to wood and stainless steel.

What materials will be used under these structures?

It is not clear to me what is meant by neutral and natural tones. Much of the equipment illustrated is painted in greens and blues. I believe these colors should not be used next to the blue/green ocean, the blue sky, and the green grass. We do not want to compete with nature.

As an extreme I want to bring to your attention the color of the Pudding Creek Bridge railing that got painted red/purple as if it is so important. Using this color gives the impression that this bridge's railing is more important than the ocean in the background and the beautiful timber trestle bridge.

I would hope that no decision is made at this Special Meeting considering that people do not have enough time to look into this issue.
