- Business to Business: 6%



#### Fort Bragg – Q2 Economic Performance



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

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## Sales Tax Future – Settling...

- National Economy The Federal Reserve began cutting rates at its September meeting. Most economists expect the Fed to continue cutting into 2025. This should make borrowing cheaper & add some energy to the economy.
- California Taxable Sales Sluggish taxable sales growth continued in Q2 2024. Overall, the economy seems to have achieved the 'soft landing' the Fed wanted, but it appears to be 'softer for longer' for taxable sales. Consumers are spending more on non-taxable services and other non-taxable items (housing, energy, etc.)
