Mendocino Coast Hospitality Center

“...Feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, and provide a path to personal self-sufficiency...”

- Over past seven years, MCHC's role has expanded significantly
- Work closely with Redwood Quality Management Company
- Safety net for people struggling with poverty, addictions and mental health issues
- Seven years ago, total budget of approx. \$100,000; today over \$1.1million
- MCHC runs programs at four facilities on the coast



Hospitality House

- 24-bed homeless shelter
- 87% of all beds occupied in 2016
- 7,597 bed nights of shelter
- 33 children with parents were in Hospitality House in 2016
- Budget \$120,000; \$40,000 from county, and the remainder from community donations
- 23,167 meals served in 2016

Extreme Weather Shelter

- Started 9 years ago by faith community
- Opens when meets “extreme” weather criteria
- Opened Nov 14; closes April 16
- Challenging program; Behavioral based
- Total EWS costs last year \$29,161.00;
- Average nightly cost 2016 - \$335.18



Hospitality North

- Transitional Housing – independent living for people ready to transition from homelessness
- 15 bed facility
- 2016 – funded through HUD
- In 2016, 84% of Hospitality North's residents moved into permanent housing, compared to HUD's target of 65%
- Very successful program

Hospitality Center



- Hospitality Center is not a day shelter. People who attend the Hospitality Center need to be engaged in its programs
- Coastal wellness center for people with mental health challenges
- Homeless resource center services
- Case management to 35 people living in their own permanent housing
- Housing Navigators
- Coordinated Entry
- Rapid Rehousing

- Specialty Mental Health Services
- Three licensed / waived clinical Therapists and one Care Manager
- One licensed Clinical Consultant
- Clinical assessments, treatment planning, care management, rehabilitation, linkage and collateral services
