RESOLUTION OF THE FORT BRAGG CITY COUNCIL AMENDING THE FY 2014/15
BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE \$134,300 FROM FUND 250 (SPECIAL SALES TAX FOR
STREET REPAIRS) FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO CYPRESS STREET EXTENSION (BUDGET
AMENDMENT #2015-29; AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$134,300; TRANSFER FROM FUND
250 TO FUND 407-COASTAL TRAIL CAPITAL PROJECT)

**WHEREAS,** in accordance with California Public Contract Code 20164 and other applicable laws, the Fort Bragg Coastal Trail & Restoration Project was bid and awarded to Granite Construction on June 27, 2014 in the amount of \$4,970,716.50 for the base bid and all alternates; and

WHEREAS, the remaining grant funding is limited and City staff have worked with Granite Construction and the construction management firm, Green Valley, to identify project components that are most critical to the success of the Project; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed Cypress Street Extension is an essential component of the project that will provide safe access from a signalized intersection; and

**WHEREAS**, paving of the Cypress Street Extension will reduce dust impacts and provide a safe and dust-free surface for vehicles and cyclists to access Noyo Headlands Park; and

**WHEREAS,** the City of Fort Bragg received a grant award from the State Coastal Conservancy which requires expenditure of a local match of \$134,300; and

**WHEREAS**, use of the Special Sales Tax for Street Repairs would meet the Coastal Conservancy cash match requirement; and

WHEREAS, in 2011, the City Council certified an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for this Project pursuant to CEQA; Title 14, California Code of Regulations, Section 15000 et seq. ("CEQA Guidelines"); and the City's CEQA Implementation Procedures; and

**WHEREAS,** on February 10, 2014, the City Council certified a Subsequent Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for this Project pursuant to CEQA; Title 14, California Code of Regulations, Section 15000 et seq. ("CEQA Guidelines"); and the City's CEQA Implementation Procedures; and

**WHEREAS**, based on all the evidence presented, the City Council finds as follows:

- 1. The proposed Cypress Street extension improvements are consistent with the requirements of the ordinance establishing the Special Sales Tax for Street Repairs.
- 2. The appropriation of \$134,300 from Fund 250 to the Coastal Trail Capital Project will provide necessary funding for completion of the Fort Bragg Coastal Restoration & Trail Project and satisfy the match requirement for the Coastal Conservancy grant.
- 3. The Street Sales Tax funds will be used solely for construction, construction management, and inspection services related to improvements of the Cypress Street extension from the Cypress Street/Main Street intersection to its terminus at the Noyo Headlands Park parking lot.
