## RESOLUTION OF THE FORT BRAGG CITY COUNCIL REQUESTING PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY TO RETROFIT STREETLIGHTS THROUGHOUT FORT BRAGG WITH ENERGY-SAVING LED FIXTURES

WHEREAS, at the March 13, 2017 City Council meeting, Geoff Pollard of Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) made a presentation regarding replacing the streetlights throughout Fort Bragg with energy-saving LED fixtures; and

WHEREAS, PG&E is implementing a program which will ultimately replace 150,000 PG&E-owned High Pressure Sodium fixtures with high efficiency LED fixtures saving approximately 50,000,000 kWh of energy annually throughout its territory; and

WHEREAS, the LED fixtures can be adjusted to the City's preferred lighting level; and

WHEREAS, LEDs provide more natural light and better visibility for improved safety and last up to four times longer than the current fixtures in place; and

WHEREAS, approximately 600 fixtures are located in Fort Bragg with an estimated approximate energy savings of 158,000 kWh and initial cost savings of \$5,000 annually; and

WHEREAS, street lighting can be deployed more efficiently; and
