Dear Fort Bragg Planning Commission:

Please revoke the non-conforming use permit for the Emergency Shelter known as the Hospitality House at 237 N. McPherson Street. The reasons listed in the Public Notice are more than enough to prove the violations have occurred with little or no concern by those in charge.

It is time for the City to require the Emergency Shelter to find a new location that:

1. can accommodate the number of beds they need and the amount of people they feed
2. has qualified staff to manage the services
3. has adequate private professional security

The Hospitality House's operation does not comply with Fort Bragg's Municipal codes. In addition to these violations they are not helping the people they promise to serve get permanent housing and rehabilitation.

It is time for the community to stop enabling this dysfunctional operation, revoke the permit and support the changes necessary to provide appropriate and adequate services to the people who need them.

The surrounding property owners, residents and businesses have suffered long enough (30 years). The truth is that businesses are closing, property values have plummeted, and this neighborhood is not safe for children and elders because of the violations cited.

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

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
