Re: Opposition to Sonar and Explosives Training and Testing in the Pacific Ocean off the Coast of Northern California

Dear NWTT Supplemental EIS/OEIS Project Manager:

The City of Fort Bragg City Council opposes sonar and explosives testing and training off the coast of Northern California. As a coastal town that depends on healthy oceanic ecosystems to support our fishing, tourism and marine science research industries, the importance of protecting our marine sea life cannot be understated. Our oceanic ecosystems, continue to be compromised by warming sea temperatures from global warming, pollution, and overfishing. Sonar and explosive testing only further stresses this frail ecosystem.

Every year in March, the City of Fort Bragg hosts a Whale Festival to champion and celebrate these complex mammals. The whales pass through Northern California twice a year during their migrations. These animals live not just off our coast but along the whole coast of North America. The Council and our Community oppose sonar and explosives testing that could harm marine life, including the whales, and encourages the Navy to limit such activities and apply mitigation measures to the degree possible to avoid such negative impacts.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on this important matter. Fort Bragg is proud of and supports the Navy and our military's work and commitment to keeping us safe.
