

ELECTIONS REVIEW COMMITTEE PURPOSE

- 1. Research and evaluate electoral systems
- 2. Evaluate options available to general law and charter cities; opportunities and limitations
- 3. Recommend a preferred electoral system
- 4. Recommend the benefits and limitations of a charter city, and (if appropriate)...
- 5. Suggest a draft charter city ordinance in time for November 2020 City Council election ballot

The Fort Bragg City Council's Election System Review Committee, established after the city's election system was challenged under the California Voting Rights Act last year, met again last Wednesday, April 3, to discuss the demographer's report commissioned by City Hall City Manager Tabatha Miller presented what she admitted was a watered down version of the report.

A portion of the hour-long meeting was spent in arguments between committee members and Miller was barely able to get through her report in the allotted time due to side-tracking, interruptions and nonagendized discussions despite some committee members' best efforts to keep the group focused.
