Zoom school presented new opportunities and challenges engaging our kids. Noyo worked with local classes to provide kelp ecosystem lessons, while a PhD student at uc Davis designed an urchin curriculum based on the conservation effort and data. Noyo center will deliver this new curriculum locally this coming school year.

RESEARCH

Six new kelp restoration projects have been funded by CA Sea Grant for a total of \$2.1million. Projects focus on genomics of bull kelp, modeling kelp recovery, assessment of kelp recovery efforts around the world, bull kelp spore production and out planting, transplanting kelp, optimizing management strategies, and understanding the dynamics of urchin recruitment, reproduction and density.



Season shortened due to covid

- Effort led by Reef Check CA
- 26,535lbs of urchin removed
- 49 vessel days
- Reduced purple 2 urchin per m²
