At a special meeting on March 24, 2020, the Fort Bragg City Council ratified the City Manager's Proclamation declaring a local emergency due to COVID-19 in its Resolution No. 4242-2020. RESOLUTION NO. -2020

RESOLUTION OF THE FORT BRAGG CITY COUNCIL CONFIRMING THE CONTINUED EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY IN THE CITY OF FORT BRAGG

WHEREAS, California Government Code section 8630 empowers the Fort Bragg City Council to proclaim the existence of a local emergency when the City is threatened or likely to be threatened by the conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property that are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of this City; and

WHEREAS, California Government Code section 8558(c) states that a "local emergency" means the duly proclaimed existence of conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the territorial limits of a city; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19, a novel coronavirus causing infectious disease, was first detected in China in December 2019 and has spread across the world and to the United States. Symptoms of COVID-19 include fever, cough, and shortness of breath; outcomes have ranged from mild to severe illness, and, in some cases, death. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has indicated the virus is a tremendous public health threat; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States issued a proclamation declaring the COVID-19 outbreak in the United States as a national emergency, beginning March 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of California and the Public Health Officer of the County of Mendocino have both issued Shelter-in-Place orders to combat the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020 the City Manager, as the City's Director of Emergency Services, issued Proclamation No. CM-2020-01 declaring a local emergency as authorized by Government Code section 8630 and Fort Bragg Municipal Code section 2.24.040(B); and

WHEREAS, at a special meeting on March 24, 2020, the City Council of the City of Fort Bragg adopted Resolution No. 4242-2020, ratifying the City Manager's Proclamation declaring the existence of a local emergency; and

WHEREAS, at a special meeting on April 6, 2020, the City Council of the City of Fort Bragg adopted Resolution No. 4245-2020 by which it continued the local emergency; and

WHEREAS, at a special meeting on April 20, 2020, the City Council of the City of Fort Bragg adopted Resolution No. 4247-2020 by which it continued the local emergency; and

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting on May 11, 2020, the City Council of the City of Fort Bragg adopted Resolution No. 4250-2020 by which it continued the local emergency; and

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting on May 26, 2020, the City Council of the City of Fort Bragg adopted Resolution No. 4253-2020 by which it continued the local emergency; and

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting on June 8, 2020, the City Council of the City of Fort Bragg adopted Resolution No. 4266-2020 by which it continued the local emergency; and

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting on June 22, 2020, the City Council of the City of Fort Bragg adopted Resolution No. 4270-2020 by which it continued the local emergency; and

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting on July 13, 2020, the City Council of the City of Fort Bragg adopted Resolution No. 4284-2020 by which it continued the local emergency; and

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting on July 27, 2020, the City Council of the City of Fort Bragg adopted Resolution No. 4289-2020 by which it continued the local emergency; and

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting on August 10, 2020, the City Council of the City of Fort Bragg adopted Resolution No. 4294-2020 by which it continued the local emergency; and

WHEREAS, at a special meeting on August 31, 2020 the City Council of the City of Fort Bragg adopted Resolution No. 4300-2020 by which it continued the local emergency; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND PROCLAIMED by the City Council of the City of Fort Bragg that for reasons set forth herein, said local emergency shall be deemed to continue to exist until the City Council of the City of Fort Bragg, State of California, proclaims its termination; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Fort Bragg will review the need for continuing the local emergency at least once every 21 days until the City Council terminates the local emergency; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution confirming the continued existence of a local emergency shall be forwarded to the Director of the Governor's Office of Emergency Services and the Governor of the State of California, as well as the Mendocino County Office of Emergency Services.

Day

RESOLUTION NO. ___-2020

RESOLUTION OF THE FORT BRAGG CITY COUNCIL RENAMING THE SECOND MONDAY IN OCTOBER AS INDIGENOUS PEOPLES' DAY

WHEREAS, Indigenous Peoples' Day is part of a national effort to recognize and honor the existence, cluster and contributions of the original inhabitants of North America on the day that has for the past 82 years been observed as Columbus Day; and

WHEREAS, many City, County and State governments across the United States have adopted a celebration of Indigenous Peoples' Day; and

WHEREAS, in 2019, Governor Gavin Newsom announced that on October 14, 2019, California would honor Native Americans on the holiday historically associated with Christopher Columbus. Recognizing October 14, 2019 as a celebration of Indigenous Peoples only applied to 2019 in California; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Bragg recognizes that the Indigenous Peoples of the lands that would later become known as the Americas have occupied these lands since time immemorial; and

WHEREAS, the City recognizes that Fort Bragg and surrounding lands have been the homelands of the Indigenous Peoples of this region, long before Christopher Columbus landed in the Americas in 1492; and

WHEREAS, Indigenous Peoples' Day was first proposed in 1977 by a delegation of Native Nations at the International Conference on Discrimination Against Indigenous Populations in the Americas in Geneva, Switzerland; and

WHEREAS, the Affiliated Tribes of Northwest Indians, comprised of American Indians/Alaska Natives and tribes in the states of Washington, Idaho, Oregon, Montana, Nevada, Northern California and Alaska, passed resolution #11-57 in September 2011 in support of changing Columbus Day (2nd Monday of October) to a legal holiday known as Indigenous Peoples' Day;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED

- 1. The City Council of Fort Bragg does hereby declare the second Monday in October to be Indigenous Peoples' Day in the City of Fort Bragg.
- 2. The City Council of Fort Bragg encourages other businesses, organizations and public institutions to recognize Indigenous Peoples' Day.
- 3. The City Council of Fort Bragg encourages Fort Bragg residents to recognize and celebrate the history and heritage of indigenous peoples in our community and across the United States.
- 4. The City Council of Fort Bragg directs the City Manager to replace each reference to Columbus Day in City documents, including but not limited to the City of Fort Bragg

Daniel McIntire and Shannon Riley presented a report to Council on this agenda item and responded to questions from Councilmembers. Council directed staff to bring back a resolution endorsing the Strategic Plan on the next regular meeting's Consent Calendar.

Matthew Drewno presented a report to Council on the plan for a community garden for Fort Bragg on the grounds of the CV Starr Community Center.

3. STAFF COMMENTS

City Manager Miller gave an update on road repair closures and reminded the public that Caltrans work will continue on Main Street overnight from 8pm to 6am through October 29, with delays of about ten minutes. She reported a drop in COVID-19 violations and that there are zero active cases of COVID in town. In Police Department notes: A new generator is now in place on Bald Hill, body cameras have been upgraded to the newest technology, and on Friday, the PD received a new jail transport van. Public Works Director Smith gave updates on water levels and water savings due to the Stage 2 water emergency declaration, and reported on Coastal Trail trash and portable toilets. City Clerk Lemos reported on ballot security for the upcoming election in November.

Mayor Lee recessed the meeting at 7:59 PM; the meeting reconvened at 8:07 PM.

4. MATTERS FROM COUNCILMEMBERS

Councilmember Albin-Smith made brief remarks about visitors and the use of facial coverings. Councilmember Peters stated that he received an email inquiring about the thin blue line stickers on police vehicles. Vice Mayor Norvell reported that there will be a halt on Measure B (Mental Health Treatment Act) spending until a business plan is developed. Mayor Lee said there have been zero new cases of COVID-19 at Sherwood Oaks for the past two weeks. Councilmember Morsell-Haye reported on the first meeting of the new Citizens Commission formed to discuss a potential name change for the City.
